Maths

Children will learn four-digit numbers, Roman numerals and rounding to 10/100/1000. This term, our focus will be on Addition Subtraction& Area, Multiplication and Division



History



This half-term children will learn about the achievements of Ancient Egyptians, when and where the ancient Egyptians lived, explain the importance of the Egyptian gods and goddesses, and will evaluate the challenges of building an Egyptian pyramid and explain how and why the Egyptians mummified people
