Dear Families

Welcome to the second half of the Autumn term. We are looking forward to an exciting term in Y5. The children have been really enthused during the first half term and are continuing to inspire their curiosity with the topic of 'Journey into the Unknown'. Within this topic, children have learned about different aspects of space. It has been lovely to see the children share their prior knowledge, and build on this. We are proud of how well the children have settled into school and are showing their engagement with all learning. Next, we will be exploring the Vikings and their legacy.

English

This term we will read **Cosmic by Frank Cottrell Boyce**. Children will write diary entries and descriptive writings about space using technical vocabulary and events from the text. They will then write a narrative about being lost in space and embark on an adventure using the text as a stimulus.




Maths

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<u>Multiplication / Division / Prime Numbers</u>. Children will need to be fluent in the arithmetic of addition and subtraction to 1000/10,000. Written multiplication methods to be taught with expanded/ compact column method. Prime and square numbers will be taught. The White Rose Scheme is followed

History

We will study Vikings and the legacy they left behind in Britain, evaluating the Viking stereotypes using different sources and comparing different versions of their sagas. We will compare their invasion with the Saxons. What did they leave behind?



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Respectful Relationships/ Internet Safety: Children will understand how to remain safe on the web at all times and how to seek help if they are struggling. They will also learn strategies to help them cope if they are being bullied.





We will look at space imagery and how it can be made to depict scenes from space. Drawing will include different mediums to show the effects of an image and relate it to popular art culture and design. Children will become familiar with the retrofuturism means of drawing and expressing themselves.
