Welcome back to the first half of the Spring term. We hope you have had a splendid festive season and all the best for the New Year 2024. The children have been really enthused during the first term when they were exploring space and will now continue to further their historical knowledge on the turbulent times of the Tudors and Stuarts for the Spring term. It has been lovely to see the children engaging with their learning where they complete a variety of tasks to get a taste of what we will be learning this term. As a learning community, we share the responsibility for our children's success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. There are lots of exciting opportunities for our children this year, our plan is to aim high and work closely with you to achieve the best possible outcomes. However regular attendance will help your child do better at school.



This term we will read **Tamarind and the Star of Ishta** by **Jasbinder Bilan**. Children will produce descriptive writings about the Himalayan mountains using technical vocabulary and events from the text. They will then write a narrative using the text as a stimulus and predict what the next chapter could be. Write in role as the main cha<u>ract</u>er from the text.

Maths



<u>Multiplication / Division / Fractions/Decimals/ Percentages</u>. Children will need to be fluent in their times tables to be successful in their understanding of the above topics. Equivalent fractions and finding decimals of fractions will be covered. Digits up to three decimals places will be taught.



The Tudors will be studied with an

understanding of how primary and secondary sources help, evaluating these for their reliability and accuracy. Children will be introduced to the idea of propaganda and its impact on History.



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To have a better understanding of the diversity of religious beliefs around us. To know about Christianity and make comparisons with their own beliefs and other religions. How and why prayer is important to some.



Painting- Portraits of Tudors using techniques of changing a drawing into a painting. They will explore and relate skills to develop and design their ideas. Colour and lines will be used to create a particular mood so that the portrait could stand out in their pictures.



Science

Topic: Forces – to understand and discuss the forces around us, gravity, air resistance, water resistance and friction. Their learning will be aided by fun experiments.
