

The children portrayed excellent behaviour and thoroughly enjoyed looking at a range of animals and loved hearing the roar of dinosaurs.





Reception









Year 1

Two Year one classes have had a super time at The Garden 120 where they were able to identify London landmarks. Children were also able to locate the landmarks on their maps. Also last week, children were able to use their PE skills to participate in a game of baseball. We finished the week off with our end of year trip to London Zoo where children were able to explore various animals from all over the world.



Year 2

As the school year comes to a close, we want to take a moment to reflect on the wonderful journey we've had together in Year 2. It has been a year filled with growth, learning and countless memorable moments. The children have worked incredibly hard and it's been a joy to witness their progress and achievements. Throughout the year, the children have had learning opportunities both in school and out that allowed discovery of something new and a chance to develop a love for learning. This year, we have explored the Great Fire of London where children were able to immerse themselves back in time with the support from a workshop to know what life was like in the past. Exploring human and physical features in our local area and other locations around the world provided the knowledge of the similarities and differences of places geographically and walking to Barking Park allowed the children to identify these geographical features in a more practical way.



Experiencing and observing a range of mini-beasts gave them a deeper understanding in Science of how animals survive through their adaptations and their habitats. Additionally, a visit to Mud-Chute farm gave them another opportunity to learn about animals in an environment in the City that may have been surprising. Developing their craft of mechanisms, the children created moving monsters that developed their skill of pivots and levers. As artists, they developed their painting and printing skills through relief printing which they thoroughly enjoyed, being inspired by Kente style. The children's enthusiasm, curiosity and resilience have been truly inspiring. It's been a privilege to see them grow academically, socially and emotionally.

Year 4

A great way to end the academic year on a high note- Year 4 children thoroughly enjoyed their geography fieldwork trip to **Southend-on-Sea**.



Our geography topic this halfterm is Coasts. This was a perfect base for children to extend their geographical learning coasts and collect relevant data. Children looked at the human and physical features found in the area; they also identified the coastal landforms formed by erosion and deposition. Furthermore, they collected data on sea creatures found in the area. Children presented their findings in various ways.



Fortunately, it was a bright, sunny day. Children played board games while enjoying delicious ice cream on the beach.

Year 3

This week, Year 3 have been busy with a variety of engaging activities. They completed their African clay masks, applying vibrant paints to finish off their creative masterpieces. In Maths, the children collected data and used it to draw bar charts, learning how to represent information visually. For English, they discussed the importance of road safety and the safe way to cross the road. Additionally, they orally performed their diary entries to other classes, showcasing their writing and public speaking skills.

During their Geography field work, the students explored the school grounds to identify and classify igneous, sedimentary, and metamorphic rocks, enhancing their understanding of different rock types, this helped them to gain a practical understanding of Geology. In Computing, they finalised their PowerPoint presentations, enhancing their technical skills, and proudly presented their projects to their class.



In RHE, the children learned about online safety. They discussed the importance of protecting personal information, recognising safe websites, and understanding the potential risks of the internet. This knowledge is crucial in helping children navigate through the digital world and become responsible individuals.

Year 5

In Year 5 we have been enjoying our Art sculpture lessons in the last few weeks. We have made Greek pinch and coil clay pots. This is a new technique we have learnt and it was great fun. Working fast with clay was tricky so that it did not dry up quickly. We had to ensure our hands were moist and worked with great precision. Learning about the Ancient Greeks and their culture and the legacy they left behind was interesting. In Science and RHE this term we have learnt about puberty and growing up- and the changes that happen in plants, animals, insects and humans.
