It was International Peace Day on Saturday and our children took the time to reflect upon how this applies to their lives. They shared how important it is to promote peace and they have decided to make a whole school display to reflect this - keep an eye out for it!

I cannot authorise any term time trips abroad so please do not ask me to do that. Every day matters to our children's learning and I want you to do your best in supporting us to achieve 100% attendance.

Article 38 (war and armed conflicts): Governments must not allow children under the age of 15 to take part in war or join the armed forces. Governments must do everything they can to protect and care for children affected by war and armed conflict.

Article 39 (recovery from trauma and reintegration): Children who have experienced neglect, abuse, exploitation, torture or who are victims of war must receive special support to help them recover their health, dignity, self-respect and social life.
