#### Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you've had a lovely summer and are as excited as we are about the forthcoming year. This academic year is full of exciting opportunities for fun-filled learning, which we are sure will engage and enthuse your children.

The children have embraced their return to school with a positive attitude and have settled well into their new classes. We hope that the excitement and thirst for learning will continue throughout the year.

We started the term with children sharing their project for the topic 'United Kingdom and Our Local Area'. Children will be learning about their country and the local area.



This term, we are reading the book, 'Time Travelling Cat and the Egyptian Goddess' by Julia Jarman. Children will be taught features of narrative writing. Later, they will be given an opportunity to write and publish one.



Maths

We shall be using the Mastery approach to Maths teaching. This term, our focus will be on the following areas: Place Value, Addition and Subtraction, Multiplication and Division, Measurement and Area.

## Geography

Children will learn about different types of maps, the Ordnance Survey map symbols, location of the UK, name and locate key mountains in the UK, the seas surrounding the country and our local area. They will then look at land use in Stratford and compare it with the way land is used in their local area.

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**History-** This term children will learn about the achievements of Ancient Egyptians, when and where the ancient Egyptians lived, explain the importance of the Egyptian gods and goddesses, and will evaluate the challenges of building an Egyptian pyramid and explain how and why the Egyptians mummified people.

## **Reciprocal Reading**

In reading sessions, we will be retrieving information, making inferences and justifying them with evidences and using context clues to infer the meaning of unfamiliar words. Children will be taught new vocabulary so please talk to them about the new words they will learn, their meaning and understanding. Children will read the book 'Ancient Egypt, Gods, Pharaohs and Cats' by Marcia Williams.

**Science**- Living Things and their Habitats- Recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways, explore and use classification keys to help group, identify and name a variety of living things in their local and wider environment, recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things.

Please make sure children practise times tables for at least 10-15 minutes a day for optimal results.
