Dear Families

Welcome back after the summer break. We are looking forward to an exciting year in Y5. We are aiming for a productive partnership with you and ensure all our children achieve their highest potential. Each Topic begins with an exciting text, where teachers introduce the Topic to the children in an exciting way. As a learning community, we share the responsibility for our children's success and want you to know that we will do our very best to carry out our responsibilities. There are lots of exciting opportunities for our children this year, our plan is to aim high and work closely with you to achieve the best possible outcomes. This term's overview is highlighted below.



English

The book we will be looking at is "The Incredible Journey" by Levison Wood. Children will be looking at writing descriptively and drawing on their reading and responses where possible. They will use the book to identify different noun types, adjectives and provide justifications for their use. They will look at text structure and sentence construction. Non-Fiction and persuasive features will be explored this half term.





Maths



<u>Place value / Addition / Subtraction</u>. Children will need to know the place value of digits in a 6-digit numbers, then rounding numbers and comparing sets of numbers. Addition and subtraction will be learnt using the column method. . Also, children will be given the opportunity to extend their learning with Mastery activities, apply their skills and knowledge and dip deeper



Geography/History



Exploring Trade: This learning includes the human Geography of trade as a global concern. Children will understand the meaning of import and export in terms of products both natural and manufactured, leading to supply chains and the steps products go through to reach the consumer (us).

Vikings: The Vikings

The learning journey begins with who the Vikings were and their reasons for invading and settling in Britain. Children will learn about the impact of the Vikings on the British society.



Caring Friendships and Respectful

Relationships: children will understand how to form and maintain positive relationships. They will understand what respect and self-respect mean and why they are important.

DT/ART

Textiles will be studied and children will make a soft stuffed toy. Sewing stitches (running and blanket) will be taught. They will use needles, scissors and thread a needle safely. They will design their own patterns and products using evaluation techniques.

In Art, children will be producing botanical drawings using elements such as lines, shapes, forms, texture, space, colour and value, drawing inspiration from Francesca Anderson.



Science/Computing

Topic: Understand the Earth's Movement in Space-children will learn about the Earth and its Moon in relation to the other planets in space. They will be able to explain why we have day/night/seasons.

In computing, children will create computer games using skills such as simplifying codes, programming simulation, decomposition and abstraction. Also, they will learn how to create and call functions, variables, string and concatenation.



Please ensure your child attends school on time every day. If s/he has a mild cough/cold or a blocked nose or feels tired, there is no reason to stay at home.
