English

We are already proud of the written work children are producing and would like them to practise legible writing whenever possible. This half-term we will start the book "Street Child". Children will write and edit their own formal letters, and write non-chronological reports this half term. We can't wait!



Maths



Children will be continuing with arithmetic, using the four operations to solve problems with whole numbers, fractions, decimals and percentages.



Our young historians will be sequencing events to understand the timeline of WW1. They will be exploring the cause and effect of the 'Great War' through the exploration of maps, sources and pictures. They will be investigating life at the Home Front and Western Front and explore the end of the War including the impact of the Treaty of Versailles.





Children will be consolidating what they learned during coding last half term and will be moving onto Unit 6.2: Online Safety and Unit 6.3: spreadsheets using the online platform: Purple Mash which children can also access at home with their login and passwords.





Continuing on from the learning children have done in Relationship and Health Education they will be looking at the areas of:

- Families and People who care for me
- Respectful relationships
- Mental wellbeing and Online relationships





Science

Students will continue with the theme of light, specifically looking at how light behaves with reflective surfaces, magnifying lenses and how shadows are formed. They will investigate how the size of shadows change throughout the day and plan, investigate and evaluate independently.
